ROMANIA

COUNTRY REPORT

1. In Romania there is a political crisis, more precisely a governmental crisis. One of the parties in the governing coalition is in a "war" with the prime minister. Due to this political situation, the ministers of the contesting party resigned, including the minister of health. In the newly created situation, the Ministry of Health will be headed by an interim minister for a period of 45 days.

2. The situation of COVID-19 vaccination of the country's population is at a low percentage, below 30% due to the refusal of the general population to be vaccinated, where reluctance to vaccine is spreading due to ingrained distrust in state institutions, misinformation campaigns and lack of awareness. This refusal has led to the expiration of vaccines over time. In order to be used effectively and to benefit other people from their effect, the Romanian Government decided that a number of antiCOVID-19 vaccines should be sold to Denmark (1,1700,000 doses), donated to the Republic of Moldova (500,000 doses), sold to the Republic of Ireland (1,000,000 doses), sold in Ukraine (100,800 doses), sold in Argentina (30,000 doses), sold in Serbia (50,400 doses).

3. Romania received until the end of July 2021 17,662,029 doses of vaccine against COVID-19. Most doses of COVID-19 vaccine received are from BioNTech / Pfizer (11,595,129 doses), then Astra / Zeneca (3,337,000 doses), Moderna (1,705,200 doses) and Johnson & Johnson (987,000 doses).

4. In the health field, doctors are vaccinated in a proportion of approximately 72%, nurses 57.65% and auxiliary staff 52.8%. The percentage of health vaccinations is close to the value needed to achieve group immunity.
